Following are some highlights from Provinces.</li> <li>Shelter school: approximately 1,361 schools are used as IDP relief camps in 13 districts of Sindh province.</li> <li>Damaged schools: approximately 5,977 schools have been damaged in Sindh, Balochistan and Punjab provinces.</li> <li>Education strategy for Rapid Response Plan of Flood 2011 (RRPF) has been produced underlining that education is life-saving and sustaining and integration of education responses into other sectors is vital for fulfilling optimum rights of children, adolescents.</li> <li>Flash Appeal: Despite deactivation of the Education Cluster, education response was successfully embedded into other Sectors.
